PCS102	Core	Immersion Shaykh al-Hind	Arabic Morphology II	Students will complete their study of all irregular verb forms (<i>mu'tal</i> and <i>muḍā'af</i>). Upon the completion of the foundational knowledge of Arabic morphology, a detailed discussion on the special meanings (<i>khāṣiyāt</i>) of the commonly used complex ((<i>mazīd fihī</i>)) and irregular (<i>ta'īl</i>) verb forms will be explained.
